I want to tell you how pleased I am to learn of the Endowment's recent action in approving a test program geared toward local arts agencies.

This is a very important first step in the Endowment's recognition of the remarkable growth and maturity that local arts agencies have undergone in the last fifteen years. These organizations now comprise a vast network of arts support across the nation which can only be further expanded and enhanced by this latest initiative.

During the 1980 reauthorization of the Arts Endowment, I explored the status and potential of the local agencies and found that, if the federal dollars and some encouragement were supplied, the arts at the local level would benefit tremendously from a relatively small investment.
