





So popular has become the Annual Aggie Ball, that the faculty voted it should rank as one of the big dances of the year.





The Athletic Association to which all male students are eligible for membership, has as its function, in co-operation with the coach, and faculty advisors, the management of athletics. By the laws of its constitution, managers of sport are elected, letters awarded, and class contests are conducted.

The treasurer is a resident member of the Faculty Advisory Committee.

At the end of the basketball season of 1920—1921, the new system of electing managers, proposed by the R. I. Club, was put into effect. This new rule, in an attempt to provide a means of election on merit, states that "from the candidates eligible for election, two shall be chosen as assistant managers by the vote of the Athletic Association. One of these men, after having served one year as assistant managers, will be chosen for manager by one vote from the Athletic Association, one vote from the coach, one vote from the R. I. Club, and two votes from the faculty". As yet there has not been sufficient time to prove the worth of this method, but in theory it is a decided advance.
