R. I. L. A. Meeting

The Executive Board of the Rhode Island Library Association decided to hold two instead of three meetings this year, a fall meeting and the annual meeting in the spring. Since many members agreed that the two separate afternoon sessions with the Institute of Instruction in the fall left little opportunity for socialibility it was decided to hold a one-day meeting of the R.I.L.A. with a morning session held independent of the Institute, a luncheon, and an afternoon session as the library section of the Institute. This arrangement was approved by Dr. Ranger.

As in the past three years, the State Division of Library Service will take charge of the other library section of the Institute on Thursday afternoon. Mrs. Congdon has arranged this program.

To meet at First Baptist Church.

The morning session of the Library Association will be held in the Assembly Room at the First Baptist Church at 10-00. Luncheon will be served at the R.I. School of Design directly across Waterman Street from the church. The church was chosen as a meeting place both because of its accessibility and for its historic associations.

Built in 1774 "as a meeting-house for the publick worship of Almighty God, and also for holding Commencement in" it has been the scene of notable gatherings from that day to this.

A full program has been arranged for the Association Meeting and in order that it may be carried out as planned, the morning session must begin promptly at 10-00 o'clock. This cannot be done unless each member arrives on time. A word to the wise -

The place of meeting for the afternoon session had not been definitely decided upon when the Bulletin went to print. Since to longer delay its publication might seriously inconvenience its many readers, it was decided to announce the place of meeting at the morning session.
