S. 251 Jan. 21, 1975
Mr. Scott of Pennsylvania.

To amend the National Foundation on the Arts and Humanities Act of 1965 to further cultural activities by making unused railroad passenger depots available to communities for such activities.

To amend and extend the National Foundation on the Arts and Humanities Act of 1965, to provide for the improvement of museum services, and to provide indemnities for exhibitions of artistic and humanistic endeavors, and for other purposes.

July 11, 1975.—Considered in executive session by Subcommittee on Education and ordered reported to full committee.

July 16, 1975.—Considered in executive session by full committee and ordered reported to Senate, amended.

July 21, 1975.—Reported to Senate by Mr. Pell (S. REPT. 94-289).

July 25, 1975.—PASSED BY SENATE.

July 28, 1975.—Referred to House Committee on Education and Labor.

Dec. 1, 1975.—PASSED BY HOUSE, amended (text of H.R. 7782 (H. REPT. 94-680) as passed by House and a title amendment).

Dec. 4, 1975.—House amendment AGREED TO BY SENATE.

Dec. 20, 1975.—APPROVED. PUBLIC LAW 94-158.

Nov. 11, 1975.—Reports requested from Smithsonian Institution, Department of Commerce, and Office of Management and Budget.

S. 3440 May 14, 1976
Mr. Pell (for himself and others).

To amend and extend the National Foundation on the Arts and Humanities Act of 1965, to provide for the improvement of museum services, to provide for cultural challenge programs, an ~~art~~ program and an American Bicentennial Photography and Film Project, and for other purposes.

May 12, 1976.—Original bill considered in open executive session by full committee and ordered reported to Senate and given this number when reported to Senate.

May 13, 1976.—Reported to Senate by Mr. Pell (S. REPT. 94-880).

May 14, 1976.—Reported to Senate by Mr. Pell (S. REPT. 94-881).

May 20, 1976.—PASSED BY SENATE with an amendment in the nature of a substitute (the text of S. 3440 (S. REPT. 94-880), as amended).

June 18, 1976.—House requested conference and appointed conferees (see p. 316).

June 30, 1976.—Senate agreed to conference and appointed conferees (see p. 316).
