I feel that this endeavor will be a help to the Trinity Square Playhouse rather than a hindrance. There is always the possibility that members of that company will be used in the national company and thus gain tremendously valuable experience. Even if it does not work out that way, I think that the climate for the appreciation of good theater will be enhanced which in turn will mean that the potential audiences for the Trinity Players will be increased.

At any rate I am pleased to know of your interest and I assure you that my primary concern will continue to be the enrichment of Rhode Island's cultural life.
