Dear Mr. Chairman:

We are writing to inform you that the Committee on Labor and Human Resources has completed action on S. 2724, legislation to reauthorize the National Endowments for the Arts and Humanities and the Institute of Museum Services. This bill was reported to the Senate on September 25.

As you know, this legislation has been at the center of an intense debate over the proper role of the federal government in funding the arts. After many weeks of painstaking negotiations, we have reached what we believe is a reasonable and responsible way to ensure the accountability of tax dollars distributed by the National Endowment for the Arts.

Our proposal mandates a series of substantive changes in grant-making procedures and provides for Endowment sanctions against any grantee who is convicted in a criminal court of violating obscenity or child pornography laws. These sanctions require the repayment of all federal funds and the debarment of the grantee from eligibility for NEA funds for a period of three years. This approach avoids the constitutional pitfalls that would be raised by the imposition of guidelines that would establish prior restraint on NEA grant awards.

With the short time remaining in the 101st Congress, there is a chance that the Senate will not have time to consider our reauthorization proposal. In light of this possibility, we want to share our language with you in the hope that you and your colleagues will consider our approach to these important issues when you take up the Interior Appropriations bill. Our compromise had the strong endorsement of the Labor and Human Resources Committee where it was reported by a margin of 15 to 1, and we believe it has extensive support in the Senate.




