It is the judgment of the Committee that the inflationary impact of this legislation as a component of the total Federal budget is negligible. In terms of the estimated total budget for the Federal Government, the new authorization for fiscal year 1977 would amount to .0006 percent of the budget. In terms of the gross national product, the new authorization for fiscal year 1977 would amount to .00013 percent of the GNP.
