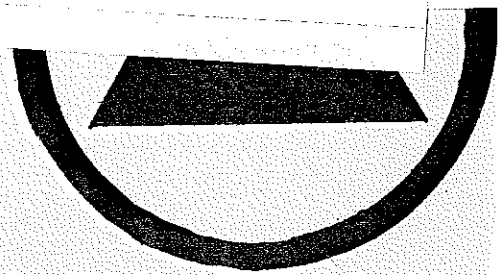

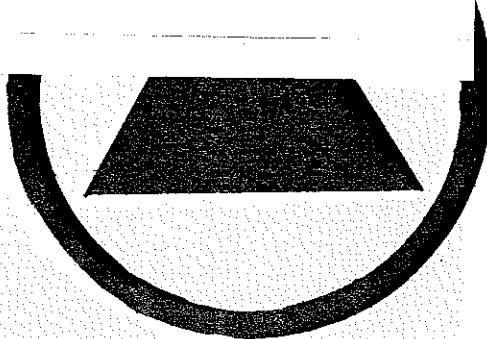

***Magnets Serve To Promote  
Trust And Understanding***

The "Safe Zone" magnet symbol shown below is a message to gay, lesbian and bisexual students and colleagues. The message is that the person displaying the symbol is one who will be understanding and trustworthy if they need help, advise or is just someone to whom they can talk.

The symbol is a pink triangle in the center with a green circle around the outside. The pink symbol has long been a symbol of gay pride and awareness of gay issues. The green circle serves the opposite effect of the popular red circle with a slash, denoting that it okay for these issues to be discussed in the area where the magnet is displayed.

Take advantage of this opportunity to become more educated and/or understanding of the issues and needs of your gay, lesbian, and bisexual students and colleagues.
