Listed below are the items of disagreement between the House and Senate LSCA bills.

- 1. House added "international" to network to permit funds to be used to fund international networks. (Martinez amendment)
- 2. House included a new authorization for Title VIII of \$12 million. (Owens amendment) There is a hold harmless to fully fund Title I at the FY 1989 appropriation before funds go the new title. If we have to accept this amendment, I suggest using our hold harmless of full funding.
- 3. House and Senate differ on language on maintenance of effort. It's extremely technical. I am checking with the Department on this one.
- 4. House added an amendment to restrict OERI from contracting out on the Education Research Library and require a study of this current practice. (Owens amendment, Coleman supported) The Administration opposes this.
- 5. House included a provision to permit drug abuse prevention as an allowable activity under Title I. (Lowey amendment)
- 6. House included language to raise the grant amount under Title V to \$50,000 from the current \$15,000. (Lowey amendment) As you know, the Senate accepted the Simon amendment which waives the maximum grant award for only 30% of the grants.
- 7. House included a new Title VIII for Family Learning Centers. (Owens Amendment) This breaks the agreement we had with the House on no new titles.
- 8. The House accepted language to permit school libraries to be reimbursed for holding summer activities under Title III of LSCA. (Gunderson amendment)
