## Francesca Mary Maresca Abstract

Title: Lesbian Health Care: An Oxymoron?

Time: Approximately 30 minutes

Audio/Visual: None

In a society such as the United States, where quality health care has become a valued commodity, it is becoming crucial for disenfranchised communities, such as the lesbian community, to become more pro-active in seeking comprehensive health care and education. The issues that affect all women include breast cancer, contraception, proper nutrition, and more specifically, sexual health.

Historically, women's access to health care has been limited by a lack of education about their own bodies, limited training of health professionals (outside of gynecology), economic barriers, and a culture that puts most emphasis on visual health such as beauty, than it does on total health. These obstacles become larger than life for certain minority groups. For lesbians, these problems are compounded by the social stigma attached to homosexuality, dearth of health services geared directly toward lesbians, and the myth that lesbians are just naturally in tune with their bodies.

The area of sexual health, including reproductive aspects, is one that receives little attention from both lesbians and health care professionals. I hope to explore the obstacles to complete health for lesbians, including the implicit gender bias that exists in medical culture, as well as the unique aspects of lesbian sexual health, especially in this era of HIV/AIDs, and the efforts that are being made to provide better health care for lesbians
