The Institute of Museum Services, a recently created federal agency within the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, today announced its first year's awards of \$3.7 million to 256 museums in the U.S.

These museums were among 859 from all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico which applied for assistance for General Operating Support or Special Projects.

Commenting on the first year's grants, George Seybolt, Chairman of the National Museum Services Board, the policymaking body of IMS, noted that the grant applications reflected the wide diversity of American museums and their programs. Applicants included art museums, children's museums, botanical gardens, historical museums, museums of natural history, nature centers, planetaria, science museums, zoological parks, aquaria, and general and specialized museums.

Mrs. Lee Kimche, appointed by President Carter as Director of the Institute, said, "In spite of the fact that this grant program was not announced until March, more than 800 of the nation's approximately 7,500 museums applied. In our second year of operation, we expect about three times that number of applications."

Funds for the awards were made possible through the Museum Services Act, Title II of the Arts, Humanities, and Cultural Affairs Act of 1976.

"The establishment of the Institute demonstrates an important shift in the federal government's commitment to museums," Kimche said.

"No longer are these institutions considered merely shelters for special projects; they are now viewed as cultural foundations which need continual support to exist, build, experiment, and expand."

The Museum Services Act specifically included these kinds of institutions in its definition of the word "museum" because many of these institutions had no other source of federal funding prior to the establishment of the Institute. Diversity also was reflected in the sizes of institutions which applied. The smallest museum's annual budget was \$205.00; the largest was \$32 million.
