Dear Senator Byrd:

To aid you and your staff as you go to conference on the Interior and Related Agencies Appropriations Bill, I have attached "Effects Statements" on two language provisions that are of concern to the Institute of Museum Services.

We strongly oppose the first provision, which would seriously undermine the philosophy of our competitive grant process by setting minimums for each state. The second provision, regarding the maximum compensation level for IMS employees, should be deleted as a technical adjustment since it has no practical effect.
