Dear Senator Pell:

I am writing in regard to the amendment to the Interior Appropriations bill proposed by Senator Jesse Helms last The Helms amendment unreasonably restricts the National Endowments on the Arts and Humanities and the Institute of Museum Services. The language of this amendment is foolish and dangerous and clearly the intention is to destroy NEA, NEH and IMS. I am shocked that the Senate would approve such legislation.

I must also protest the ban on NEA grants to the Southeast Center for Contemporary Art and the University of Pennsylvania's Institute of Contemporary Art. I believe it is dangerous and inappropriate to legislate what appears to be "punishment" of these institutions.
