IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

Mr. Pell introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on _____

A BILL

To extend the Museum Services Act for two years, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 That this Act may be cited as the "Museum Services
4 Amendments of 1979".

5 Sec. 2. Section 206 of the Museum Services Act is amended
6 by adding at the end thereof the following new subsection:

7 "(c) Procedures for reviewing grant applications under
8 this section may not be subject to any review outside of the
9 Institute."

10 Sec. 3. (a) Section 209 of the Museum Services Act is
11 amended by striking out "each of the fiscal years 1979 and
12 1980" and inserting in lieu thereof "the fiscal year 1979

1 and for each of the succeeding fiscal years ending prior to
2 October 1, 1982''.

3 (b) Section 209 (d) of such Act is amended by striking
4 out ``1980'' and inserting in lieu thereof ``1982''.
