# INSTITUTE OF MUSEUM SERVICES AWARDS GRANTS FOR CONSERVATION PROJECTS

WASHINGTON, DC -- Linda Bell, acting director of the Institute of Museum Services, announced today the 171 recipients of the 1993 Conservation Project Support grants totaling almost \$3 million. There were 362 applicants for these matching Federal grants.

Ms. Bell commented, "I am pleased to announce the names of the institutions receiving Conservation Project Support. These museums have proposed projects that will ensure the future of their collections by providing for general surveys, improvements to environmental conditions, and for the treatment of collection objects identified as conservation priorities. A wide variety of museums have been awarded funding for projects which have been judged by peer panels of museum and conservation professionals to be outstanding."

The Institute of Museum Services offers two deadlines each year for proposals for the Conservation Project Support grant. The next deadlines are October 15, 1993 and April 1, 1994. Among the award recipients are:

**Zoological Society of San Diego, California**: to support a study of the effects of environmental sounds and bird songs for the purpose of improving the well-being of birds in captivity, and advancing endangered species conservation.

**El Museo Del Barrio, New York, New York**: to conduct a detailed condition survey of recent donations of Pre-Columbian art, and for developing a long-range conservation plan and disaster plan for the collections

Mary & Leigh Block Gallery, Northwestern University, Evanston, Illinois: For conservation treatment of two works in the outdoor sculpture collection Miro's *Monument Erected in the Middle of the Ocean to the Glory of the Wind*, and his bronze rotating sculpture, *Constellation*. These treatments are conservation priorities in the museum's long range conservation plan.

The Institute of Museum Services (IMS) is an independent Federal agency, part of the National Foundation for the Arts and Humanities. It was established by Congress in 1976 in recognition of the vital public service museums provide as community centers of education and keepers of the collections that are our cultural patrimony. IMS provides assistance for operations and conservation activities through competitive and non-competitive programs to: natural history, art, history, and children's museums; zoos; nature centers; science and technology centers; botanical gardens; arboretums; and planetariums.

The policies of IMS are determined by the National Museum Services Board, whose 15 members are appointed by the President and confirmed by the Senate.
