Dear John:

Many thanks for your two recent letters and for keeping me abreast of the developments regarding your petition to the Merit System Protection Board.

It is my understanding that the Endowment has appealed the MSPB's recommendation and that a final decision on the appeal is still pending.

I have asked the staff of my Subcommittee on Education, Arts, and Humanities to keep me apprised of all developments in this matter and, in particular, to inform me of the Board's final ruling.

The Endowment's re-authorization legislation will hopefully be completed when the Congress returns in mid-November and the Subcommittee has no plans to hold further hearings until this legislation has been enacted and implemented by the Endowment.
