The chairman of the National Endowment for the Humanities benefits from the advice of many people, including panelists, reviewers, staff members, and the National Council on the Humanities.

The National Council is a board of twenty-six citizens that advises the chairman. Each member is nominated by the President of the United States and confirmed by the Senate to serve a six-year term. The National Council meets four times each year to review grant applications and to comment on matters of policy. The law requires the Chairman to make all final decisions about funding.
