In response to our telephone conversation today, I am enclosing a copy of my testimony before the platform committee of the Democratic National Committee in Newport on April 3, 1976 regarding the need to properly celebrate the era of American Independence Bicentennial.

I believe that Senator Pell's bill, S-3100, would serve a very useful purpose for the State of Rhode Island. I would be pleased personally to appear at any appropriate hearing either here in Rhode Island or in Washington. I would also be able to arrange supportive testimony from the Rhode Island Bicentennial Commission as well as the Bicentennial Council of the 13 Original States.
