I appreciate having the opportunity to respond to your letter opposing the inclusion of the Arts and Humanities Endowments in a new Department of Education.

I favor the concept of accoring the arts and humanities cabinet-level status and recognition. I believe this could ultimately be accomplished through a Department of Education and Culture which guarantees that the position of the arts and humanities is strengthened and not diminished. I realize, however, that achieving this goal may not be possible at this time. Accordingly, I favor the establishment of a Department of Education that does not include the two Endowments.
