A belated thanks for your help in giving me advice, information, etc.. about Safe Zones programs - we were able to get our modest grant from the university and are completing our first year of operation here at James Madison. We have had about 70 plus faculty and staff go through the program and display the Safe Zones logo - this at a state supported school of about 12,000 students - a pretty conservative campus. So far a little debate in the school paper - one pretty silly 'anti' letter after a good feature article on the program - but no flak from our most conservative Board of Visitors members - at least not so far.
