The Library Impact Statement for BUS 348X *Business of Social Global Design Innovation* states that students will be conducting library research in the course, “such as finding journal articles, creating annotated bibliographies, writing papers.”

The Library Impact Statement provides “examples of the types of journals, monographs, and electronic resources” the course will use. These include six books, which I have ordered (though one or two may be out of print).

Of the five journals listed as examples, the University Libraries can provide access to four:

- *International Journal of Design* (ISSN: 1991-3761) [available in ABI/Inform from 1997 to present]
- *Global Society* (ISSN: 1360-0826) [Available through online subscription, 1997 to present]
- *Journal of Globalization and Development* (ISSN: 1948-1837) [available in ABI/Inform from 2003 to present with 6-month embargo]
- *Journal of Critical Globalization Studies* (ISSN: 2040-8498) [available open access]
- *Exploring Globalization* [journal not able to be identified]

Given the fact that the University Libraries has a) adequate funds for one-time purchase of books as needed, b) continuing access to the full-text business database ABI/Inform, and c) subscriptions to most journals from all the major publishers, it is my opinion that there are more than adequate resources to support the needs of assignments in this course.

Thus, based on my review of the Library Impact Statement and the sample syllabus for BUS 348X, I conclude that the University Libraries can meet the needs of this course with no additional resources.

In my role as Subject Selector for the College of Business Administration, I support the addition of this course without reservation.
