I am returning herewith Faculty Senate Bill #243, over which there was some confusion.

I am prepared to accept deletion of the adjective "dependent" from paragraphs 1 and 2 of the section of the University Manual involved. However, having now had an opportunity to discuss the legislation with my colleagues, I would ask the Senate to have the initial wording of both paragraphs read as follows: "Spouses and children (who are unmarried and under age 21 at the time of original registration and remain continuously registered) of faculty...."

This wording would, on the one hand, make it possible for faculty children to become married while in school and to stay beyond age 21 without loss of this benefit; on the other hand, it would preclude certain possible abuses which might make it very difficult to have the proposal accepted by the Board of Trustees or Board of Regents.

If the legislation is acceptable in the proposed form, I would change the word "faculty" to "employees" before seeking final approval.

The Faculty Welfare Committee recommends that the first three paragraphs of Section 7.8.4d of the University Manual, 8th ed., page 70, be deleted and be replaced by the following:

d. Special fees for families of faculty.\* Spouses and dependent children of faculty, enrolled as full-time undergraduates in the University, shall pay all regular University fees except the "General Fee."

Spouses and dependent children of faculty, who are not full-time students, may be registered, with the approval of the Registrar, for no more than 3 courses up to and including 11 credits in any one semester for undergraduate work and no more than 2 courses up to and including 8 credits in any one semester for graduate work. They shall be entitled to the privileges of the class, apply credits toward degrees, and be subject to the same fees as defined for the University employees (cf. 7.8.4c). In satisfaction of the University's senior residence requirements, however, only one semester of full-time academic work will be required of undergraduate degree candidates.

\*"Faculty" replaces the word "employees" in the Manual. Committee feels the same privileges should be extended to all regular employees of the University, as at present, but feels it is not in a position to recommend legislation for employees other than faculty.

#### Comments:

The Welfare Committee was asked last year to clarify the statement in the Manual concerning fees for families of faculty. As

indicated in the footnote above, the Committee feels the same privileges should be extended to other employees of the University, but feels that it is not within the Committee's powers to recommend legislation for employees other than faculty.

The changes recommended by the Committee can be summarized as deleted and be replaced by the followings follows:

- Exemption from the "General Fee" is extended to spouses as well as dependent children enrolled as full-time undergraduates.
- 2. Special fees for part-time students are provided for spouses and dependent children, rather than wives and dependent children.
- The limitations on courses and credits for part-time students have been broken down into undergraduate and graduate work.
- The requirements for fulfillment of the senior residence requirements have been simplified and clarified.

It should be noted that the last paragraph of Section d is not affected and remains unchanged.
