Dear Lella:

After talking with Walt Mueller and after Ned Gordon searched the Senate files, I have been able to determine what happened to the resolution concerning selection of a President for the University. During 1969-70 when the Senate enacted legislation concerning the establishment of Search Committees to advise on filling important administrative vacancies, a separate resolution was adopted on April 23, 1970 pertaining to the Presidency. Dr. Baum forwarded this resolution to the Board of Regents for endorsement indicating that the Senate considered it a matter of unusual importance. He also indicated his willingness and that of Senate's representatives to discuss the matter with the Board.

However, the Board did nothing with the resolution then or subsequently. It has simply sat on it and probably by now has forgotten it. I will introduce the matter for discussion and action at the next Executive Committee meeting. It fits into a topic we have been exploring — the relationship of the University to the Board. Personally, I would like to bring the resolution back to the Senate for reendorsement and then transmittal, by way of the President, to the Board. But I can not anticipate the response of my colleagues.

I greatly appreciate your calling this matter to our attention.
