The University of Rhode Island, University Libraries has suitable existing resources to support LSC 599: Visual Literacy and Global Media, proposed by Prof. Yan Ma. A search of the Libraries' catalog by keyword ("visual literacy" reveals 217,000 results, identified by format as follows: 197,000 articles, 454 book chapters, 145 book titles, 138 conference proceedings, and 2 journals. Searching by Library of Congress Subject Heading (LCSH) the catalog retrieved 1,224 entries.

Prof. Ma has not requested any essential journals or required library materials for the course, thus no special or specific library funding is necessary for the course. Information research mastery sessions can be arranged if requested.
