Refer to: Faculty Senate Bill #70-71-1, title "Disruptive Activity."

Dear Walter:

I am returning to you, approved, the referenced Bill.

I feel it necessary to communicate to you the serious reservation I have as to the adequacy of this measure.

It is clear to me from certain recent events on our campus, as well as from the action by civil courts across the nation, that clear and precise definitions of "disruptive activity" are essential to serve as definite guidelines for all members of the University community. It should be clear to all that certain types of dissent are permitted, but that there are definable limits to these activities.

It may very well be that such legislation is not necessary in the sense that it will seldom or never be used. This is not the issue. In order to protect the rights of all and to insure the free expression of ideas, there must be guidelines set forth that will guarantee that these goals are met.

I urge you to expedite thorough consideration of more adequate legislation to deal with disruptive activities on campus. Failure on our part to provide adequate measures toward self-governance will only open the way to governance from without; this would be, to say the least, undesirable.
