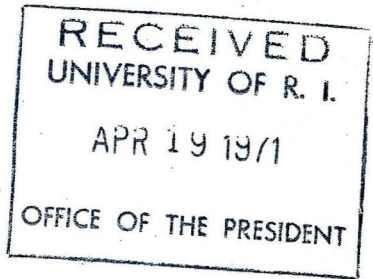

CURRICULAR REPORT FROM GRADUATE COUNCIL TO THE FACULTY SENATE

At its Meeting No. 83 on April 2, 1971, the Graduate Council considered and approved (where necessary) the following curricular matters which are now submitted to the Faculty Senate for information or confirmation as indicated.

I. Matters Requiring Confirmation by the Faculty Senate:

A. College of Business

1. Department of Finance

a. Add (New)

FIN 491, 492 Special Problems in Finance Sem I and II 3 credits each  
Directed readings and research work involving financial problems under the supervision of a member of the staff. Prerequisite: Permission of instructor. STAFF

B. College of Pharmacy

a. Department of Pharmacognosy

a. Add (New)

PCG 551, 552 Chemistry of Natural Products Sem I, II 3 credits  
Introduction to the chemistry of certain groups of natural products especially in relation to their chemotaxonomic position in plant classification. Topics limited to secondary metabolites: e.g. terpenoids, phenolic compounds, aromatic compounds, phytosterols, and alkaloids. (Lec. 3) Prerequisite: Chem 222. In alternate years, next offered 1971-72. SHIMIZU AND TASHIRO

b. Change

PCG 359 Public Health. Change as follows:

PCG 459 Public Health Sem I 3 credits

A study of the principles of prevention and control of disease and the application of this information to current health problems. Prerequisite: Bact. 201, PCG 446 or permission of instructor. WORTHEN and CANNON (Lec. 3)

b. Department of Medicinal Chemistry

a. Delete:

PCH 547 (PCG 547) . Change course offering from alternate years to Sem II yearly and revise catalog listing to read as follows:

PCH 548 (or PCG 548) Physical Methods of Identification Sem II 3 credits  
Advanced course in the utilization of physical methods (primarily spectroscopic) in the structure elucidation of complex organic molecules. Emphasis on interpretation of ultraviolet, infrared, nuclear magnetic resonance, mass and optical rotatory dispersion spectra. (Lec. 3) Prerequisite: CHM 425 and/or permission of instructor. TURCOTTE, TASHIRO, SHIMIZU, ABUSHANAB
