CURRICULAR REPORT FROM GRADUATE COUNCIL TO FACULTY SENATE

At its Meeting No. 90 on November 19, 1971 the Graduate Council considered and approved the following curricular matters which are now submitted to the Faculty Senate for information or confirmation as indicated.

I. Matters Requiring Confirmation by the Faculty Senate

A. College of Arts & Sciences

1. Department of History

a. Add (new)

HIS 401(421) History of England 1485-1660 Semester I, 3 cr
Political, economic, and religious change from the beginning of the Tudor dynasty to the Puritan Revolution and the Commonwealth. (Lec 3) Gutchen

HIS 402(422) History of England 1660-1815 Semester II, 3 cr
Political, economic, religious and cultural change from the Stuart restoration to the emergence of Britain as a world power at the end of the Napoleonic wars. (Lec 3) Gutchen

HIS 403(422) History of England 1815-1896 Semester I, 3 cr
The impact of industrialization and urbanization on political, economic, religious, and cultural forces in the Victorian age. (Lec 3) Gutchen

HIS 404(423) History of England Since 1896 Semester II, 3 cr
History of Britain since 1896, with emphasis upon the changing role as a world power, the impact of economic change on politics and society, and the development of the social welfare state. (Lec 3) Gutchen

HIS 421: Tudor and Stuart England 1485-1714 (contingent upon approval of HIS 401)

HIS 422: England in the Eighteenth & Nineteenth Centuries (contingent upon approval of HIS 402 and HIS 403)

CHE 573 Mechanical Metallurgy Semester I or II, 3 cr
Behavior and response of metals to mechanical plastic forming. Property control by analysis and design of industrial metal processing. Principles of annealing, forging, rolling, extruding, rod, wire and tube drawing. Recent advances and developments. Prerequisite: Permission of Instructor. (Lec 3) Mohrheim
