At its Meeting No. 94 on February 4, 1972 the Graduate Council considered and approved the following curricular matters which are now submitted to the Faculty Senate for information or confirmation.

I. College of Business Administration

A. Department of Accounting

1. Changes

(Catalog description to read as follows:)

ACC 611 Managerial Accounting

I and II, 3 cr

Determination of accounting information for the purposes of decision making, control, and evaluation with emphasis on decision models using accounting information. (Lec 3) Prerequisite: ACC 910 Staff

(Prerequisite change as follows:)

ACC 618 Current Accounting Theory--change prerequisite from ACC 312 or 611 to ACC 910.

B. Department of Finance and Insurance

1. Changes

FIN 410 Capital Markets -- change prerequisite from ECN 123 or 126 to FIN 332

FIN 433 Bank Financial Management--change prerequisite from "permission of instructor and senior or graduate standing" to FIN 332 or permission of instructor.

C. Department of Marketing Management

Properties of ceramic materials as related to starting materials and forming, densification and finishing processes. Emphasis on resulting phases and microstructure. Application of physical and chemical principles to tailor properties to engineering needs. Prerequisites: CHE 437 or equivalent. (Lec 3) Rockett

III. College of Arts & Sciences

A. Department of Education

EDC 451 was approved by the Graduate Council at the 900 level for no graduate program credit and with the provision that the course requirements which distinguished between graduate and undergraduate credit be eliminated accordingly.

EDC 951 Human Resource Development: The Art of Helping I, 3 (Fall 1972) (To be offered as a fifteen week television course through URI Division of Extension) Knowledge of the understandings and skills essential for teachers, counselors, social workers and other community leaders involved in the helping relationship in both individual and group settings. Not for graduate program credit. Rife
