Interim Report

FACULTY SENATE GENERAL EDUCATION COMMITTEE

March 14, 1972

The General Education Committee recommends that the following course be added to Division C of the University General Education requirements and so listed in the catalog:

RDV 100 Natural Resource Conservation 1, 3

Introduction to man's use and management of his natural resources; land, food, forests, wildlife, water, minerals, and air, with a survey of contemporary resource-use problems in environmental pollution. (Lec. 3)

Kupa and Staff

NOTE: The description of Division C on page 21 of the catalog would be changed to read: "... psychology (except 210, 381, 410, 434); Resource Development 100; sociology; and Speech 210, 310, 374."

COMMENT: This course is taught from the generalist's viewpoint and has been very popular with students throughout the entire University. The committee feels that its content, motivation, and presentation are eminently suitable for inclusion in Division C of the General Education requirements.
