The Providence Campus Library has holdings in all areas. The State-wide delivery system allows easy access to the holding of the Kingston and Narragansett Bay libraries. In addition we have cooperative borrowing agreements with the other libraries in Rhode Island and the United States. We have a growing collection of online resources as well. The 2019-20 allocation for the purchase of monographs for the Providence Campus Library is \$10,000. There are funds available to acquire any monographic materials faculty request for the support of this program. The cost of journal subscriptions is not broken out by department or college.
