Faculty Senate Curricular Affairs Committee One Hundred and Fifth Report

At its meeting of November 4, 1975, the Faculty Senate Curricular Affairs Committee considered the following curricular matters now submitted to the Faculty Senate for confirmation:

College of Home Economics

CHANGE: Curriculum Requirements that appear on p. 73 of the 1975-76 Undergraduate Bulletin as follows:

- a. Group I General Education, 45 credits.

Division B (18, 15 or 12 credits)

Home Economics students must take one course in either biological science or chemistry.

- b. Group II Home Economics Core, 12 credits

In addition to HEC 001, students are required to select and pass 12 credits of course work from the following:

CDF 150 or 200 or 355; FNS 101 or 207 or 237;
HMG 210 or 320 or 340; TXC 103 or 224.
