The Curricular Affairs Committee shall, however receive information about any temporary University College mini-course after it has been approved by the college dean. The Graduate Council may refuse to grant or may attach conditions to the granting of graduate program credit for the course. Each college may require internal channels of approval in addition to those specified here.
