The Library Impact Statement for MHM 502 *Leadership in Healthcare Management* states that students will be conducting library research in the course, and the proposed syllabus confirms this. The Impact Statement explains, "Students will write a term paper about any healthcare leadership topic identified in the course outline and course map. The paper should explore a personal hypothesis of leadership that is important in health care. The student will explore the literature and research appropriate to that hypothesis and analyze and recommend actions about their learning."

In response to the question about what critical journals, monographs, and electronic resources the University Libraries must have to support the course, the response is, "In reviewing the URI library website, the following journals that are needed for the course are listed as available online through the URI library portal." Nine journals are listed, seven of which the URI Libraries have current access to. (*Frontiers of Health Services Management* is available online only through 2017, and *Harvard Business Review* is not available online.)

Despite limited access to two of the listed journals, based on my review of the Library Impact Statement and the proposed syllabus for MHM 502 *Leadership in Healthcare Management*, I conclude that the University Libraries can meet the needs of this course with no additional resources.

In my role as Subject Selector for the College of Business, I support the addition of this course.
