## ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE REPORT #77-78-4

April 11, 1978

#### BACKGROUND:

On advice of the University Registrar, the Academic Standards and Calendar Committee has recently reviewed University Manual regulations concerning auditors (8.39.70 and 8.62.18). The existing Manual sections do not provide a definition of 'auditor' and as a consequence, in some circumstances it is unclear whether a given individual should be charged a fee for auditing. Furthermore, although present regulations state that an auditor can "take no part in the exercise of the class," the Committee agreed that the degree of participation allowed an auditor ought to be at the discretion of the course instructor. The recommendations below address both of these points.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Academic Standards and Calendar Committee recommends:

1) that existing University Manual section 8.39.70 be replaced by the proposed section 8.39.70 as indicated below:

Existing 8.39.70

Proposed 8.39.70

An auditor may be admitted to class with the consent of the instructor and a card of admission from the Registrar, provided he takes no part in the exercises of the class, such as recitations, discussions or tests. He shall have no record in the office of the Registrar.

An auditor is any person who has permission to attend a course but is not taking the course for credit. An auditor may be admitted to a class on a space-available basis with the consent of the instructor as indicated by the instructor's signature on an audit authorization form that must be filed in the office of the Registrar. An auditor's name shall not appear on official class rosters, on the grade report, or on the permanent academic record. Auditors shall be charged no fees for auditing a class.

2) that existing University Manual section 8.62.18 be deleted. (N.B. If proposed 8.39.70 is adopted, existing 8.62.18 would be unnecessary.)

Existing 8.62.18

An auditor under the provision of 8.39.70 shall be charged no fee.
