FACULTY SENATE RESEARCH POLICY AND FACILITIES COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 2

POST DOCTORAL RESEARCH FELLOW

Over the past few years, there have been numerous requests for the University to officially create the position of Post Doctoral Fellow. Some reasons for doing so that have been suggested are:

- Increasingly, universities are requiring one or more years
 of post doctoral experience for newly hired faculty.
- "Permanent" employees (Research Associates should be differentiated from these very limited employees.)
 - Some grants and/or contracts have limited funds and may not provide for mandated salary increases in accordance with pay plans.
- 4. Occasionally, because of acquired expertise, it is desirable for a URI student who has completed his doctorate to continue on at a more responsible level for an additional year.

In general, it would seem desirable to create this position, which would be on a clearly limited basis at an agreed-upon salary, for which the Principal Investigator had more direct control over hiring (i.e., for very specific expertise).

It would avoid, at least in some instances, assigning inappropriate titles such as "Visiting Assistant Professor", etc.

ITEMS REQUIRING SENATE ACTION

The following new section of the University Manual is proposed.

7.11.27 Postdoctoral Research Fellow shall be a person engaged in research work in a specialized subject area for specific externally funded research projects. Appointments are normally made for a period of 1 to 2 years, with a possible extension of an additional year in unusual circumstances. Postdoctoral Research Fellows may hold their titles without reference to rank or salary schedules.
