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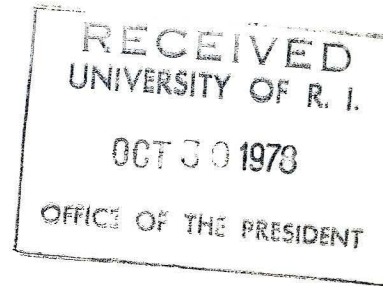



During the summer and at its October 6, 1978 meeting, the Curricular Affairs Committee  
considered the following matters now submitted to the Faculty Senate.

## SECTION I

Informational Matters (Including Temporary Courses):

## A. College of Arts and Sciences

## 1. Department of Art

- a. DELETE: Prerequisite for ART 251, 252
- b. CHANGE: Description for ART 361, 362:

ART 361, 362 Modern Art (1 and II, 3 each) De-  
velopments in art of Europe and America in the  
nineteenth century with emphasis on painting  
and sculpture. (Lec. 3) Pre: 252 or permis-  
sion of the department. Onorato

## 2. Department of English

- a. CHANGE: Description for the following courses:

- 1) ENG 103 Introduction to Literature (1,3)  
The experience of literature through readings in  
fiction, poetry and drama. Discussion and criti-  
cal writings of six to eight essays. (Lec. 3)  
Staff
- 2) ENG 330 Introduction to American English (1,3)  
A comparison of prescriptive and descriptive  
grammars and their effect on our attitudes concerning  
American English. The influence of contemporary  
language studies on literary criticism and the teaching  
of English. (Lec. 3) Arakelian

- b. CHANGE: Title and description for ENG 332:

ENG 332 The Evolution of the English Language (1,3)  
The history of English from its Germanic origins,  
through Norman invasions, the Renaissance, and the  
Age of Enlightenment. Special attention to the cul-  
tural forces which molded a standard dialect. (Lec. 3)

3. Scratch Program

ADD: SCRO00A-X College Writing for Adults (I and II,3) College-level readings and discussion as a basis for instruction and practice in the specific types of written work required in college courses. Not open to students who have earned more than twelve college credits. Offered only through the Division of University Extension. Staff

B. College of Resource Development

Department of Food Science & Technology, Nutrition and Dietetics

ADD: FSN 308X Nutrition in Growth and Pregnancy (1,3) Examines current issues in maternal and child nutrition as related to growth and physical development. Discusses specific nutrition-related problems including development of food habits, food consumption patterns and nutrient requirements. Pre: 207 Caldwell

Curricular Matters Which Require Approval of the Faculty Senate:

1. Department of Art

DELETE: ART 355

2. Department of Geology

CHANGE: Title, description and prerequisite for GEL 320:

GEL 320 Hand Sample Mineralogy and Petrology (1,4) Crystallography and physical properties of minerals related to crystal structure. Composition, classification, genesis, and interpretation of rocks as related to geologic occurrence. Emphasis on hand sample identification. (Lec. 2, Lab. 4) Pre: 103, or 105 and 106, and CHM 101 or 103 (or concurrent registration). Hermes and Cain

College of Arts and Sciences

a. Department of Botany

CHANGE: Description for BOT 424

BOT 424 Plant Ecology (11,3) Distinguishing, describing and determining the composition of plant communities, with a bearing on the landscape and the role of human-kind as an agent for change. Literature, special projects and reports, ecological techniques, field trip. One all-day field trip. (Lec. 1, Lab. 4) Pre: 262, 323 or 402. Palmatier.

b. Department of English

CHANGE: Title and description for ENG 430:

ENG 430 American English and Its Dialects (1,3) A study of the regional and social varieties of American English with emphasis on and field work in New England dialects. (Lec. 3) Arakelian

c. Department of Microbiology

CHANGE: Prerequisites for the following courses:

- 1) MIC 405 (or BCP 405) Electron Microscopy Laboratory (1,2) Pre: Prior or concurrent enrollment in 403 and permission of instructor.
2) MIC 491, 492 Research in Microbiology (1 and 1, 1-6 each) Pre: Open only to seniors in microbiology curriculum.
