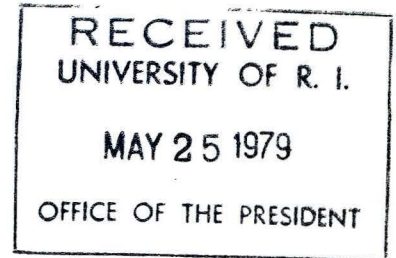

Divisional Assignment of courses

- A. Moved: That ATS 101X (Analytical and Critical Methods in the Humanities) be accepted for Division A credit in the University's General Education Requirements.
- B. Moved: That ATS 102X (Analytical and Critical Methods in the Social Sciences) be accepted for Division C credit in the University's General Education Requirements.
- C. Moved: That QTS 100X (Quantitative Thinking Skills) be accepted for Division B credit in the University's General Education Requirements.

Rationale: The members of the Committee feel that these courses, which are part of the College of Arts and Sciences' experiment in general education, are appropriate for General Education; the College of Arts and Sciences has approved the three courses for distribution credit in divisions A, C, and B within the college.
