This portfolio is a log of the documents and tools used in the organizing of the Distinguished Visiting Artist Residency in November 2017. Being a student here at URI has allowed me to find and explore my many different passions. Through a grant awarded by the Office of the Provost, the Distinguished Visiting Artist Grant, the theatre department was able to bring in artist Rob Neill. Rob Neill is a New York based artist and founding ensemble member of the New York Neo-Futurists. I was able to combine my love of theatre and event planning to coordinate a two-week residency of workshops for Neill. I also completed hands on work in production managing the one night only performance of *The Infinite Wrench* by The Neo-Futurists. There were many aspects of this project that included working on the marketing and publications, coordinating workshops with professors in multiple departments, and managing all areas of the technical production. I was able to learn and expand my knowledge of event management and how to work with the different departments on campus as well as external professionals in the field of theatre.

In creating the residency for Rob's two weeks here at URI, I coordinated the schedule of workshops with professors and staff. Rob attended theatre, writing, and business classes while also doing workshops in the College of Business and for faculty. I was also the Production Manager for the performance by The Neo-Futurists which entailed, creating their day-of schedule, organizing volunteers, managing registration and check in, and overseeing the front-of-house activities.

"Rob studied at Grinnell College, the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts, the Warsaw Academy and The National Theater Institute. He moved to Manhattan in 1995 to write and perform *Too Much Light Makes the Baby Go Blind* and ever since has worked as a Neo-Futurist as well as with numerous other New York companies. He was involved the NYC Fringe for *Icarus and Aria*, *Doughboy*, and *Neo-retro-Woyzeck* in addition to writing and producing *Tightening at the Belt*, *The 6-Pack* and *Apocalypse Neo* with the New York Neo-Futurists."

He is a founding member of the NY Neo-Futurists and managing director.

Production Management

TECHNICAL RIDER

Presenter shall provide the space, equipment, and personnel listed below. Controls for the lighting, houselighting and sound equipment shall be set up in the same location so that a single tech person (provided by Artist) can control all three of those functions.

1. LOBBY/THEATER ENTRY SPACE

Presenter will provide a space for rolling-in (if applicable) and name-tagging the audience in the lobby or theater entry area, along with at least one table and chair.

2. STAFFING – FRONT OF HOUSE AND TECHNICAL

There will be a Technical Director/Facilities Manager acting with authority on behalf of Presenter available to Artist at all times Artist or its employees are present on site.

Presenter will provide at least two box office staff/ushers to assist with audience handling, beginning at least one hour prior to performance.

Presenter shall make the venue available to Artist for load-in and rehearsal at least two hours prior to the opening of the house.

3. PHYSICAL FACILITY REQUIREMENTS

Minimum stage dimensions are 15' wide x 12' deep x 12' clear overhead. The floor will have no protrusions, obstructions, holes, metal bits or other imperfections. The floor shall be swept and damp-mopped by Presenter's staff prior to all rehearsals and performances. The floor must be of a sufficiently rugged surface that it can withstand becoming wet and dirty. Wings and backstage area must be safe and clear of excessive stored materials.

Presenter will provide one well-lit and clean dressing room with space for 10 performers, equipped with chairs, tables, mirrors, electrical outlets, easy access to restrooms and drinkable water. Dressing room must be lockable.

4. RIGGING, PROPS, ONSTAGE ELECTRONICS

Presenter shall provide:

One Edison circuit at either side of the stage, at the edge of the performance space Hooks in the wall or some other provision to allow Artist to hang a clothesline from edge to edge of the performance space between 8'6" and 10' high, preferably halfway upstage.

12 clean bath towels

2 non-rolling chairs (e.g. Wenger) with straight backs and without armrests

3 rehearsal blocks, preferably black

18'-10' A-frame ladder

5. AUDIO

Presenter will provide a set-up, working, professional-quality audio system consisting of at least the following:

A professional-quality CD deck capable of auto-pause

2 onstage microphones with stands. Wireless preferred. Wired mics to have 20' cable minimum.

Stereo input(s) for iPod or laptop at the control position

A mixing board with sufficient inputs for the above

High quality stereo house PA and at least 2 onstage monitors

6. LIGHTING AND EFFECTS

Presenter shall provide lighting equipment sufficient to provide at least:

Clear (no color) front, back and side washes to evenly cover the entire performance space Clear center down pool

The ability to completely black out the stage and front of house (other than exit signs) If possible, Presenter shall also provide lighting equipment sufficient to achieve the following washes/concepts:

Warm and cool front washes

Blue SR side wash

Red SL side wash

Four specials: Down center down, down center front, SR and SL front specials.

Strobes that can be controlled from the booth

Amber DR to UL diagonal

Lavender DL to UR diagonal

7. GENERAL CONDITIONS

Presenter shall provide/ensure the following:

- A. At all times the Artist is in residence, the Presenter will provide hospitality including bottled water, coffee, tea, soda, a variety of fruit juices and fruits, assorted snacks such as crackers, nuts, chips, vegetables, candy, meats and cheeses, etc., to accommodate a company of 10.
- B. On the day of first performance, should scheduling preclude a two-hour dinner break, Presenter shall provide a fully-catered hot meal with vegan option during the dinner break for 10 people.
- C. Video shoots and photo calls must be approved and scheduled prior to arrival. All costs for such activity, including crew expenses, are the responsibility of the Presenter. Copies of any photos or video shall be provided to Artist not more than two weeks following the final performance.
- D. Public access to the theater during rehearsals or technical time must be approved by Artist. No persons shall be admitted backstage other than Artist or Presenter personnel.

8. AUTHORITY

- A. Artist requires the exclusive full use of the facilities from load in through load out, except as agreed in advance.
- B. Artist reserves the right to approve all technical decisions, in consultation with the Presenter, with regards to the personal safety of Artist and its employees and the artistic integrity of the performance. Artist may delay or cancel a performance if conditions are not sufficient to ensure such safety and artistic integrity. Artist shall make commercially reasonable efforts in good-faith cooperation with Presenter's and/or venue's staff to avoid any delay or cancellation.
