1. What library holdings already exist in relevant subject categories. How much money is now allocated in the subject area?

The Library has substantial current and historic monographic holdings in relevant subject areas. The 2017-18 allocation for monographs for Soc/Anthro is approximately \$7800. We expect the allocation for 18-19 to be similar. The library also has access to hundreds of relevant journals, both in paper and online formats. The cost of journal subscriptions is not broken out by department.

2. Does URI have the essential journals as noted in the Faculty Questionnaire?

URI has access to the essential journals noted in the Faculty Questionnaire. We subscribe to JSTOR. We have Anthro Source from about 1990 to the present, and we subscribe to NACLA-Report on the Americas online from 1996 forward.

3. What new resources are required to support the course (including media, electronic, or other non-print materials)?

No new library resources are required to support this class.
