FACULTY SENATE

On April 11, 1974, the Faculty Senate approved the following amendments to sections 5.20.12 and 5.20.14 of the <u>University Manual</u> as recommended in the Report of the Board on Student Conduct and Scholastic Integrity:

- 5.20.12 The Appeal Board shall have jurisdiction over appeals from decisions of the Board on Student Conduct and Scholastic Integrity, and other student judicial boards when an allegation of fraud, denial of rights, unfairness or mistake, or a claim of previously unavailable or unknown material evidence is put forth by the appellant.
- 5.20.14 The Appeal Board may return the case to the board that conducted the original hearing for a new hearing or it may dismiss the appeal.
