

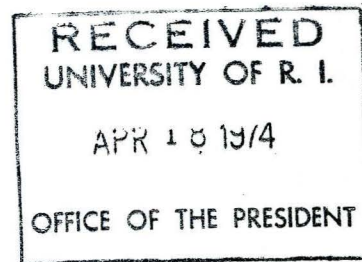

8.52.10 Opportunities and Privileges. The following aspects of the honors program shall apply to all participants: Honors thesis work or an equivalent independent project (this may take the form of creative achievement in the fine arts) and participation in six credits of interdisciplinary colloquium.
