The University Libraries hold a broad array of materials in areas covered by the History curriculum. Currently, \$5,000 per year is allocated for History purchases.

No specific journals are noted. The main US History-related database that URI subscribes to - America: History and Life - covers a broad spectrum of historical topics, but additional databases may also contain useful supplementary information, such as Academic Search Complete, JSTOR, Sociological Abstracts, National Newspapers, and African American Newspapers. The Libraries are also acquiring collections of primary source materials that may supplement student research.
