SPECIAL REPORT OF THE ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE

The Academic Standards and Calendar Committee recommends that the following proposal for making up three days of classes, cancelled because of the water problem, be approved by the Faculty Senate.

 $(\underline{8.45.11}$ Any deviation from announced attendance policy shall be a matter between the instructor and students. A student who finds that he will be or has been unable to fulfill any obligation should initiate being excused from that obligation and should arrange with the instructor for making up missed work. This regulation applies to any student regardless of his status.)

- 1. That make-up classes be optional, determined jointly by the instructor and students taking into account the nature and structure of the individual course.
- 2. That classes missed on Wednesday, November 13, 1974 be rescheduled on the evenings of Tuesday, November 26, 1974 and Thursday, December 5, 1974 as follows:

- That classes missed on Thursday, November 14, 1974 be rescheduled at their regular meeting times on Saturday, December 7, 1974.
- 4. That classes missed on Friday, November 15, 1974 be rescheduled at their regular meeting times on Sunday, December 8, 1974.
- 5. That attendance requirements shall not be enforced for these make-up classes.

- a) Final examination period shall be inviolate. It is already reduced below an optimum time slot for both students and faculty.
- b) Prior commitments and outside work-hours of both students and faculty will conflict with some part of any proposal for make-up time.
- c) If no schedule is provided as a starting point there could well be chaos in the search for free times and free rooms.
- d) In some courses make-up work may not require face to face sessions of students and instructors.
- e) The impact of lost class time will vary from course to course. If accreditation is a factor, the issue could be critical.
- f) If time for make-up of subject matter is provided in a course on an optional basis, can the instructor use the subject matter as a basis for an examination question? Probably, if the instructor gives notice as to the topics at issue. The instructor must find a solution in this context, such as when there is no textbook.
- g) Wednesday, Dec. 4, will remain a special day at the University. Invitations and plans are well along.
- Probably any plan is workable only under a spirit of cooperation between faculty and students. There is no intent to make the plan mandatory.
