1. Department of Art

ADD: ART 309 Drawing III

Further problems in drawing with emphasis on independent investigation in the areas of analysis, planning, and supportive notation. (Studio 6)
Prerequisite: ART 208 or permission of instructor. Staff

2. Department of Botany

a. ADD: BOT 245 Plant Physiology

1, 3

Processes underlying the physiology of the whole plant. Emphasis on fundamental principles and interrelationships of plant functions in growth and development. (Lec. 3) Prerequisite: BOT 111 or BIO 101, CHM 104 and 112. Albert

b. CHANGE: BOT ~~442~~ Change in number, title, course description and prerequisite to read:

BOT ~~445~~ (~~442~~) Advanced Plant Physiology

11, 3

Covers major areas with emphasis on quantitative and metabolic aspects of plant processes and their relationships to growth. (Lec. 2, Lab. 3) Prerequisite: CHM 124 or 227, BOT 245, or equivalent or permission of instructor. Albert

c. On page 35 of the URI Bulletin under Botany delete BOT ~~442~~ and add BOT 245 on list of required courses.

3. Department of Music

a. CHANGE: MUS ~~251~~ to 254 as follows:

MUS 251 Applied Music as Minor or Elective

Lower division. Private instruction. One forty-minute lesson and scheduled practice hours each week. Two levels, one per year, as prescribed in applied minor syllabi. (Studio 6) Prerequisite: Evidence by audition of at least two years' study at intermediate or high school level and permission of the department. Staff

MUS 261 Applied Music Major I and II, 3 each

Lower division. Private instruction for applied majors only. One sixty-minute or two thirty-minute lessons and scheduled practice hours each week. Two levels, one per year, as prescribed in applied major syllabi. (Studio 9) Prerequisite: Evidence by audition of substantial study at intermediate level and permission of the department. See under Music 251 for areas of instruction. Staff

C. CHANGE: MUS 451 to 454 as follows:

MUS 451 Applied Music as Minor or Elective I and II, 3 each

Upper division. Private instruction. One forty-minute lesson and scheduled practice hours each week. Two levels, one per year as prescribed in applied minor syllabi. (Studio 6). Prerequisite: Completion of applied minor lower division and permission of the department. See under Music 251 for areas of instruction. Staff

D. CHANGE: MUS 461 to 464 as follows:

461 Applied Music Major I and II, 4 each

Upper division. Private instruction for applied majors only. One sixty-minute or two thirty-minute lessons and scheduled practice hours each week. Two levels, one per year, as prescribed in applied major syllabi. (Studio 12) Prerequisite: Completion of applied major lower division and permission of the department. See under Music 251 for areas of instruction. Staff

E. DELETE: MUS 252, 253, 254, 262, 263, 264, 452, 453, 454, 462, 463 and 464.

F. ADD: MUS 250 Recital Laboratory I and II, 0 Credit

Required of all music majors.

H. Add the following at the end of the present statement on Music Education:

Education 102, 312 and all courses listed above under Music Education, with the exception of Music 321 Orchestration and senior-level courses in applied music, instrumental classes and major ensembles, must be completed before entering supervised student teaching. Further, the practice teaching schedule must be preceded by two weeks full-time observation at the assigned school with at least one week observing the critic teacher. Another week is to be spent in observing in other schools. A follow-up seminar for all student teachers will be conducted each week of the practice teaching period.

*In this series of eleven courses one is to be omitted in the area of the student's major instrument.

I. ADD: *MUS 393 UNIVERSITY CHORUS 4

On pages 45, 46 and 47 of the 1972-73 URI Bulletin to the music curriculums for PIANO AND ORGAN, ORCHESTRAL INSTRUMENT, MUSIC HISTORY and LITERATURE, and MUSIC EDUCATION. Elective credits to be reduced accordingly. MUSIC EDUCATION totals 57 credits.

Add footnote *MUST be taken for one semester each academic year.

J. ADD: On page 32 of the 1972-73 URI Bulletin in the Bachelor of Music Curriculum.

"The total number of credits for graduation in Music Education is 126."

4. Department of Physical Education for Women

A. CHANGE: On page 49 of the 1972-73 URI Bulletin, change as follows

PHYSICAL EDUCATION FOR WOMEN

This curriculum is designed for women students who wish to teach physical education at the elementary or secondary school level. In addition to a major concentration in the professional area, students are provided a liberal educational background. Completion of the program fulfills the requirements for teacher certification by the state of Rhode Island.

Analysis of urban processes and policy formation affecting urbanization in the United States, Europe and selected developing nations. (Lec. 3) Prerequisite: PSC 113 or PSC 116 or permission of department. Milburn

6. Department of Zoology

A. ADD: ZOO 242 (142) Introductory Human Physiology I and II, 3

Functions of the organ systems of the human body and their coordination in the whole human organism. Attention is given to the needs of students preparing for health-related professions. (Lec. 3) Prerequisite: BIO 102 or ZOO 111 or 121. Harrison
