Dear Werner:

While this legislation technically involves confirmation of Senate Bill #72-73--30, "Report of the Presidential Committee to Investigate the Feasibility of Instituting a Peripheral Parking System on Campus," which you disapproved on March 20, 1973, we believe that it is more appropriate to transmit it as a separate bill in view of the central thrust of the legislation and in view of the amendments that were added to it.

Vice President Ferrante reported to the Senate what you had already told the Executive Committee: namely, that you had earlier in the year decided to postpone implementation of a peripheral parking system. Thus, the central purpose of the legislation is to create a committee to study alternatives to or modifications in the proposed system of peripheral parking, a committee that will, in the language of the Preamble to the Senate Constitution, "act in the best interests of the University as a whole and of all its parts."

Since the Spring Recess intervened, and since we delayed in transmitting this legislation, I have indicated May 10th as the date the legislation becomes effective. In effect, we have treated the recess as non-legislative days.
