Dear Werner:

When the attached legislation was presented, the Executive Committee recommended that the Curricular Affairs Committee and the new University College and General Education Committees become appointive. The Senate decided, however, that they should remain elective committees. As a consequence, the Executive Committee will present at the May 17th meeting further proposals concerning these committees. We will recommend that the University College and General Education be elective on the same basis as Curricular Affairs Committee and that the Chairman also serve for a two year term. We will also recommend that the number of representatives from Arts and Sciences on each committee be increased.

I would like additionally to call your attention to Section (F) which recommends that the president name the Chairman of the Research Policy and Facilities Committee as the second faculty member on the Space Allocation Committee. This was not a matter that the Senate could legislate.
