FACULTY SENATE

On November 29, 1973 at its sixth meeting, the Faculty Senate approved the following recommendations presented by Senator Frank White in his report for the President's <u>ad hoc</u> Committee on the Energy Crisis:

- That the University remain open, with increased attention to energy conservation measures, and that contingency plans be prepared to cope with possible energy emergencies.
- 2. That the President be requested to negotiate with the University's energy suppliers to secure, if possible, a favorable supply position which reflects our status as the state university and our demonstrated achievements in reducing energy consumption.
- 3. That Energy Conservation Monitors be appointed for each university building, responsible and accountable for insuring efficient energy consumption in said building on a continuous (24 hour) basis; and that said monitors be provided, where appropriate, with additional pay and/or faculty service units for these duties.

4. That the Ad Hoc University Energy Crisis Committee be instructed to prepare and publish weekly Energy Reports for the university community for the remainder of the academic year.
