On Thursday, February 14, 1974, at the tenth meeting of the Faculty Senate, the following recommendation of the Ad Hoc Committee to Study Athletics and Physical Education was approved:

6. We recommend that club sports be placed under the jurisdiction of the Intercollegiate Athletic programs, that a coordinator be appointed, and that money for Club sports appropriated by the Athletic Council be listed as a separate item in the general budgets approved annually for Intercollegiate Athletics.
