- chairperson West reported that at the Development Council's meeting of April 15, the Council had been informed of the reasons for the Library's policy of not appraising books to be donated. He reported that the Library's estimating the value of such books is considered a conflict of interest by the IRS. He stated that the Library would provide potential donors with a list of estimated values for books and was willing to help faculty find book appraisers.
- 9. The Executive Committee discussed a request from the Office of Student Life that the Faculty Senate appoint the alternate to the Board of Student Conduct in the spring rather than the fall. Following discussion, it was agreed that it would not be appropriate to do so because appointments to committees for 1982-83 were the responsibility of the 1982-83 Senate and its officers. It was suggested that committees which may be required to meet during the summer be indicated as such on the Committee Preference Sheets to be circulated in May.

Following discussion it was agreed that the Senate's representative to the Alumni Association Executive Committee could be elected by the Senate at the Senate's organizational meeting each spring, rather than waiting until the fall.
