#### ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE

Report #82-83-7 Military Service June, 1983

The Academic Standards and Calendar Committee recommends that existing sections 8.18.10 - 8.18.20 of the <u>University Manual</u> be deleted and replaced with the following revised section 8.18.10:

8.18.10 Military Service. Veterans who have completed six months or more of active duty in some branch of the United States Armed Forces may be awarded no more than one credit in basic physical education and three credits in military science for their military experience. Credit awards will be determined by the dean of the college in which the student's degree is to be awarded. An additional credit allowance may be granted by the student's dean in accord with the recommendations of the American Council on Education handbook, A Guide to the Evaluation of Experiences in the Armed Forces, when appropriate to the student's curriculum.

Rationale: The Academic Standards and Calendar Committee originally proposed the deletion of all existing sections of the University Manual on Military Service (8.18.10 - 8.18.20) in its Report #81-82-2. After meeting with a representative from the Department of Military Science and reflecting upon the issue, the Committee voted unanimously to recommend the approval of a revised section 8.18.10 and the deletion of the existing sections in the 8.18 series. The Academic Standards and Calendar Committee believes that the Senate should authorize the academic deans to award some credit for military experience when the dean believes the military experience and training pertains to the student's degree program. The Committee would like to stress that its recommendation does not guarantee students credit for military service but permits deans to award credit when appropriate.
